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School Overview

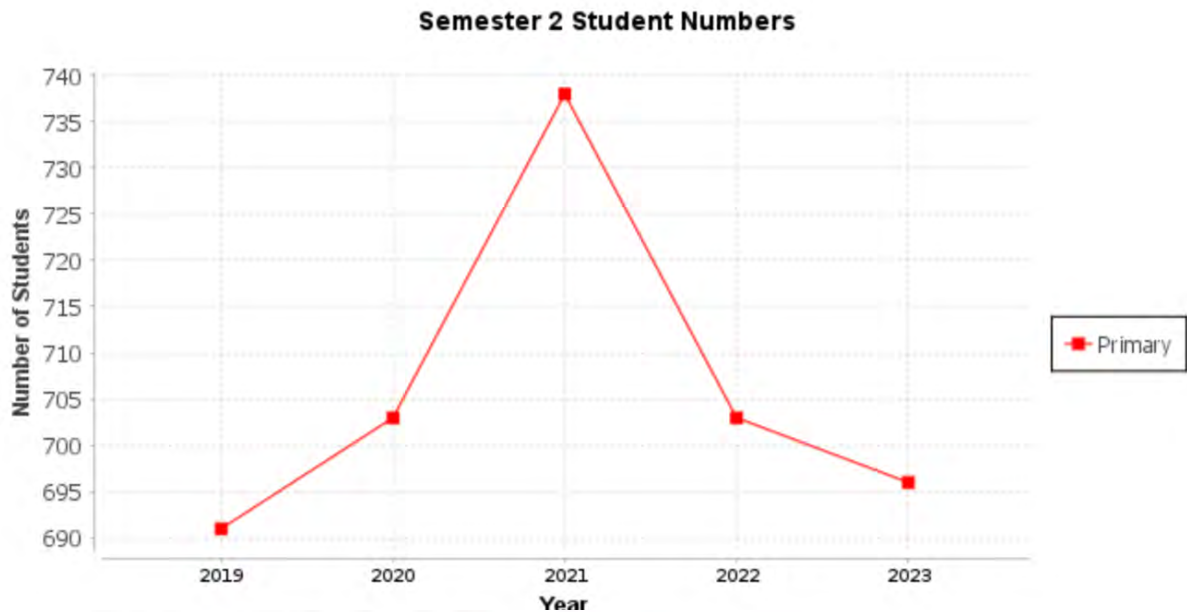
Vasse Primary School, an Independent Public School, retains a distinctly rural character in a semi-suburban location. This is a school with clearly articulated values and its particularly pleasing rural ambiance which contributes significantly to a 'sense of place' for students.

Learning is more than an academic pursuit; it is a 'total picture', which provides a balance between a student's intellectual, physical, emotional, and relational needs. To support this approach, we create an environment where **People** (relationships), **Place** (belonging) and **Pedagogy** (learning and teaching) are prioritised. Teachers use a mix of explicit and inquiry/ play based teaching strategies so students not only have an opportunity to develop their academic abilities, but their curiosity and questioning skills are also developed in a rich and engaging environment. To further enrich our students' learning we provide a wide range of specialist areas to complement the core learning curriculum. The school offers unique programs in Music, Art, Science and Physical Education. The school actively promotes inclusive pastoral care and fosters the development of social and emotional well-being.



Student Numbers and Characteristics

In Semester Two 2023, we had 790 enrolments. 696 students from Pre-Primary to Year 6 and 94 Kindergarten students.

Comments:

Fulltime student numbers have fallen by about 42 over the last 3 years. This could be due to several reasons, that are outside our school's control such as housing availability and affordability. Student numbers are expected to drop again in 2024 but are anticipated to rise again in the future with land releases and new building taking place across the region. Vasse has a high proportion of students who are funded due to Disability.

A goal for 2024 is to investigate better school wide processes and teaching practices in this area.

Student Attendance

Attendance of students at Vasse is generally pretty good and are at or above the WA Public Schools average in 2023.

Comments

COVID related issues have continued to impact student attendance rates in 2023. Many families reported more sickness than previous years and were more cautious, keeping them home more often. There was an increase in regular attendance in 2023 when compared to 2022, but it has not reached the rates it was prior to COVID. The importance of attending school is promoted through the newsletter, teacher/parent meetings/ contact and assemblies. Vasse introduced an SMS system to advise parents of absence without explanation in 2023. It is followed up by teachers through Dojo messages, phone calls and meetings. Schoolwide monitoring of attendance is done by a Deputy Principal and attendance letters are sent out twice a term. Attendance plans are developed for those in the severe category.

In 2024 a focus could be to increase regular attendance at the school and to continue reminding parents of the importance of attending, as well as implementing some practices to target those not attending regularly.

Comments:

All teaching staff meet the professional requirements to teach in Western Australian public schools and can be found on the public register of teachers of the Teacher Registration Board of Western Australia.

The school has experienced significant staffing changes over the last few years with many of the permanent staff retiring and younger staff members taking their place. In 2023 there were many (approximately 17) staff on fixed term contracts due to leave- prominently maternity leave. There were three level 3 teachers. The leadership team saw a number of changes in 2023 with 6 Deputies working in job share roles due to sickness.

In 2024, a target is to stabilise the leadership team and to further investigation into how we can encourage more of our staff to become middle leaders and/ or level 3 teachers would be beneficial.

Student Achievement and Progress - NAPLAN

Due to the new measurement scales in NAPLAN, comparisons between 2023 and previous years are not made.

Comments

2024 focuses could be to continue the whole school PLD Reading program across classrooms to increase proficiency levels and to further investigate teaching of comprehension and decoding in middle and upper primary levels. Investigate how to extend our students writing/ spelling skills across the school. Strengthen the consistent approach to teaching Mathematics through the whole school program Maths Trek and to include warm-ups across the school.

Vocabulary Goal - By the end of 2024 - all classes will have 60% above the normed median

Growth in our ACER results at the end of 2023 showed that although we have not met our growth targets yet, there was a marked improvement in Reading comprehension across the year levels with between 25% and 122% growth. Spelling and Vocabulary also exceeded expected growth in all year groups.

Focus for 2024 should be to continue with our whole school PLD Reading and Vocabulary focuses and to analyse Maths Brightpath data across the school (ACER was dropped in 2023 as a measurement tool by the committee).
