From the Principal's desk

World Teachers Day - Friday 25 Oct

A number of years ago I read a great book call "Teacher Man" by Frank McCourt (the author of "Angela's Ashes"). The book was an autobiography of McCourt's teaching journey in Ireland. McCourt writes about his growth in the profession, particularly his focus on connecting with students through story telling about his own life and experiences as a student. Whilst he challenged the system and the schools' administrators, he made a great impact on the students, often turning around their lives for the better.

Teachers are more than just the deliverer of knowledge and the developer of skills. They become a part of the student's life. Like McCourt, as my career has progressed, the more and more I have come to realise that good teacher / student relationships are a key ingredient into positive student outcomes. Having been at Vasse PS since April, I can see the teachers adopt the same thinking and work hard to connect with, and care for you children. They don't switch off at 3.05pm or when they walk to the carpark. They can spend their evenings thinking about the day, what worked and what didn't. They think about the issues impacting students and how they can help the children. Often, they take home the burdens and worries for a child. Sometimes, these can even be distressing circumstances that children and families are experiencing. I could go on and on. My point is, the Vasse teachers genuinely care about your children and work hard to support them, help them learn and make a difference to their lives. I cannot praise them enough!

Tomorrow (Friday), I encourage you to thank your child's teacher for the job they do, for their care and compassion, and the place they have in your child's life.




Just in case you missed it! Vasse Fathering Group Pines Mountain Bike Trail Ride


